Psychiatric Service Animals Workshops

OKLAHOMA CITY (June 24, 2011) – Increasingly, mental health clinicians are recommending that patients partner with a psychiatric service dog as an adjunct to their current treatment plans. It is common knowledge that service dogs are beneficial for people with physical impairments like blindness and broken or missing limbs. It is also known that such animals can help patients with certain medical ailments such as diabetes or epilepsy.

But did you know that service animal assistance dogs can also assist those living with mental illness and other brain disorders?

It might surprise you, but therapeutic service dogs are used to help treat a variety of psychiatric issues: depression, anxiety, post traumatic stress, schizophrenia, bipolar and autism just to name a few. These animals can help their owners build self-esteem, develop relationships and improve socialization skills. In some cases they can even sense oncoming episodes of mental illness and be utilized as a suicide prevention tool.

The "Animals Connecting People" workshops will teach participants the many ways to incorporate animals toward improving human quality of life. They will discuss the difference between official service animals and therapeutic animal interaction/intervention teams.
